## **Background**

Article V, Section 4, "Selection and Tenure," of the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Bylaws designates the college superintendent/president and chief financial officer as ex-officio voting directors of the corporation. The other three directors shall be selected as follows: one (1) academic administrator appointed by the superintendent/president; one (1) regular faculty member nominated by the Academic Senate and appointed by the superintendent/president; and one (1) student member nominated by the Associated Student Body Government and appointed by the superintendent/president. In addition, one (1) college trustee serves as a non-voting director.

#### 4. Information

#### 4.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Mr. Black referred to the Athletics budget and noted that additional funds were needed due to expenses related to playoffs and may come in a little over budget at the end of the year. Mr. Black noted contingency funds are set aside in the event teams do well and make it to the playoffs. He reported that Associated Student Body Government (ASBG) will end up right at budget and will be funded early in July.

Ms. Schwartz reviewed the PCPA financials. She noted final budget projection outcomes are dependent on *Beauty and the Beast* ticket sales, the scholarship campaign, and Summerfest. She commended PCPA departments for keeping their expenses down. Ms. Schwartz shared that *Beauty and the Beast* and *You Can't Take It With You* both went over projections in ticket sales. Mr. Black added this report does not reflect deferred sales, which he estimated to be about \$200,000. Ms. Schwartz also noted ticket sales for *Lend Me A Tenor* were about \$20,000 less than projected. Mr. Black and Ms. Schwartz commented it has been a good budget year overall.

Trustee Hall inquired about repairs needed for the Solvang Theaterfest and how they may impact PCPA shows in Solvang. Ms. Schwartz responded that it could impact PCPA because some of the repairs need to be completed within the next 1-2 years. If the repairs are not done in time, PCPA may have to consider whether or not to do shows in the summer at the Solvang Theaterfest.

Trustee Hall asked for an update about the temporary restrooms at the athletics fields. Dr. Walthers said that the college went out to bid twice and the bids came back too high. Dr. Walthers explained the next steps to get a permanent restroom facility built. He noted the temporary unit has been working and they are nice restrooms. Dr. Walthers also shared that the two houses the college owns will be renovated to assist the college and PCPA with housing guests. This will create a savings of about \$40,000 a year in hotel expenses.

#### 4.b. Oral Reports

There were no oral reports from PCPA, Athletics or ASBG.

#### 5. Adjournment

Dr. Kevin Walthers adjourned the meeting at 9:35 a.m.

#### **Background**
