  - 6.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Michael Black reviewed the ASBG, Athletics and Student Clubs financial reports, noting there was a lot of activity in clubs. Dr. Walthers added that the amount of money going to ASBG was increased substantially this year, which helps their club activity. Dr. Walthers also noted the college is required to control all the funds. Any fundraiser money must return to the college, not go into individual student bank accounts, for auditing purposes and internal controls. Mr. Black explained the process of how a club is formed noting new clubs are given \$100 as seed money. Mr. Black complimented this year's student government group for creating a nice campus climate and engaged students.

# 7. Oral Reports

7.a. <u>PCPA</u>

Mark Booher reported *Beauty and the Beast* accomplished their goal and met the halfmillion dollar revenue mark, which was the most revenue on a single show. The next show will be *You Can't Take It With You* opening this weekend and PCPA is in rehearsals for *The Whipping Man* which will be in the Severson Theatre opening in a couple months. Mr. Booher reported they are planning Season 54 and are in the rights acquisition process of the planning. He also acknowledged the new fire-proof curtains in the Severson Theatre and thanked Dr. Walthers and Dr. Railey for their support in getting the new drapery. New theatre seats will also be coming soon, by mid-April.

Michael Black commented that he was pleasantly surprised with the PCPA financials through December. The cash flow from *Beauty and the Beast* has been helpful. He noted that we will start to see monies going out in the balance of the year. *Beauty and the Beast* was a third of PCPA's revenue goal, and PCPA is at 94 percent of their fiscal year goal. Jennifer Schwartz shared PCPA is at 90 percent of their ticketing goal for *Can't Take It With You* and *Whipping Man* is also selling well.

Ms. Schwartz identified some budgeting challenges with the California minimum wage, employer taxes, and health benefits increases. She has been discussing options with Dr. Walthers and Mr. Black. It can be an increase of \$250,000-\$300,000 a year. One possible option is having employees pay for a share of their health benefits. More information on this topic may be brought to the next Auxiliary Programs Corporation board meeting.

Dr. Walthers asked if the play *Fences* was the same play as the movie in theatres now. Mr. Booher replied it is the same. Dr. Walthers added that it was interesting timing with the movies *Beauty and the Beast* and *Fences* coming out at the same time as the play productions. Mr. Booher acknowledged it will be interesting to see if the timing of the movies promote interest in the play, or patrons could also argue that they have seen the movie and don't want to see the play. Ms. Schwartz noted the tickets are selling well for *Fences* so far. Dr. Walthers complimented the work from PCPA staff and shared that he meets monthly with Mr. Booher and Ms. Schwartz to discuss PCPA.

Trustee Hall asked about PCPA productions in Lompoc. Dr. Walthers explained there is not a venue available in Lompoc, but he would like to think about having interns or members of the cast do smaller events as fundraisers for Lompoc. Mr. Booher added he has been asked to be an advisory member for the Lompoc Theatre Group which may open the doorway to do collaboration in the future. Dr. Walthers agreed we should be expanding PCPA's presence in Lompoc and will also be having conversations about the Solvang Theaterfest as well. Dr. Walthers added the PCPA outreach program does include Lompoc schools.

# <u>ASBG</u>

Mia Alvara shared today's events on campus were Bow-WOW and the Staff vs. Students basketball game. Future activities include Black History event, Diversity Day, Women's Day. Ms. Alvara invited everyone to attend the student events.

# Additional Comments:

Mr. Booher added there are 125 students on campus today from Pine Grove Elementary School visiting the theatre and then attending tonight's basketball game.

Trustee Hall asked if the high school students attend tours like the elementary schools. Mr. Booher replied PCPA has good relationships with the drama faculty, but it really depends on the school's ability to transport students. PCPA does have a strong matinee program where high school students attend, but tours for high school students only occur 1-2 times a year. Trustee Lahr added that tours of the theatre are given on Career Exploration Day for junior and senior high school students.

# Background

PCPA has historically paid 100 percent of all full-time employees health insurance. With the rise in health insurance costs and the pressure on the PCPA budget due to mandatory California minimum wage increases, PCPA would like to establish a cost-sharing plan with the employees.

## Fiscal Impact

As of April 19, 2017, the FY 2017-2018 tentative budget estimates health insurance costs for PCPA at approximately \$335,000. One hundred percent of these costs are paid by PCPA. PCPA is trying to close a gap of approximately \$300,000 in the budget. PCPA is requesting that employees on the health plan cost-share at \$100 per month. This would be a savings of approximately \$40,000 a year for PCPA.

Due to the California minimum wage increases, many of our employees on our health plan received a 5 percent raise last fiscal year and will receive another 5 percent raise on January 1, 2018. These raises will aid our employees in cost-sharing their health insurance.

#### Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Board of Directors approve the cost-share of \$100 per month for all PCPA employees covered by the health plan effective July 1, 2017.
