Background

Article V, Section 4, "Selection and Tenure," of the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Bylaws designates the college superintendent/president and chief financial officer as ex-officio voting directors of the corporation. The other three directors shall be selected as follows: one (1) academic administrator appointed by the superintendent/president; one (1) regular faculty member nominated by the Academic Senate and appointed by the superintendent/president; and one (1) student member nominated by the Associated Student Body Government and appointed by the superintendent/president. In addition, one (1) college trustee serves as a non-voting director.

• The superintendent/president appoints Robert Curry, Associate Superintendent/Vice President, Academic Affairs, to serve as the academic administrator for 2018-19.

4. Information

4.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Mr. Black noted an inaccuracy on the budget report due to the timing of the budget report print date. He reported there will be an upcoming budget transfer for Athletics and student clubs were active, yet under budget.

Jennifer Schwartz provided the budget report for PCPA. She stated PCPA was behind for contributed and earned revenue and is expecting a deficit of \$200,000 this year. She distributed a conservative projected budget through the end of the year. The board of directors reviewed and discussed the budget projections provided.

Ms. Sanders inquired about loss of revenue in concessions. Ms. Schwartz responded that there were smaller audiences this year. Dr. Walthers clarified it was not actual loss in revenue, it was less than expected projections.

4.b. Oral Reports

Athletics:

Kim Ensing reported student athletes are signing scholarships to universities. She noted the Athletics department is excited about a possible bond. Ms. Ensing shared the college is partnering with Under Armour brand for the next three years, which includes discount pricing and free championship gear.

PCPA:

Ms. Schwartz reported PCPA is working on updating an employee handbook. She also highlighted upcoming events including *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* moving to Solvang, PCPA graduation, and SummerFest.

Ms. Schwartz said PCPA has announced its next season and shared program titles including *Peter Pan* for the holiday show, *Shakespeare in Love*, *The Wolves*, *A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder*, *Million Dollar Quartet*, *Addams Family*, and *The Importance of Being Earnest*. In the fall, there will be a special engagement of *An Iliad* and *Muthaland*.

ASBG:

Inri Serrano reported ASBG is wrapping up the year. He commended the ASBG board members for doing a good job fulfilling their positions. Mr. Serrano shared he looks forward to being the next Student Trustee. He will be seated at the June board meeting.

Background

Currently student athletes are allotted \$11 for meals when traveling to Cuesta College or Santa Barbara City College for athletic events. For all other locations, there is a \$14 allotment for meals per student. The allotment does not cover the actual costs of meals, especially when teams are on the road for eight or more hours. Trips that require overnight stay are extremely problematic. Coaches are running out of options to ensure students are fed before and after an event.

The California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) set \$20 as a standard meal allotment when teams are participating in play-offs. There are no athletic rules that govern regular season competition or the allotment distributed to student athletes. Current guidelines of \$11 - \$14 have been in place for 10 years.

Fiscal Impact

The fiscal impact is estimated at \$20,000.

Background
