Background

Article V, Section 4, "Selection and Tenure," of the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Bylaws designates the college superintendent/president and chief financial officer as ex-officio voting directors of the corporation. The other three directors shall be selected as follows: one (1) academic administrator appointed by the superintendent/president; one (1) regular faculty member nominated by the Academic Senate and appointed by the superintendent/president; and one (1) student member nominated by the Associated Student Body Government and appointed by the superintendent/ president. In addition, one (1) college trustee serves as a non-voting director.

- The superintendent/president reappoints Dr. Robert Curry, associate superintendent/vice president, Academic Affairs, to continue serving as the academic administrator for 2023.
- On a nomination from the Academic Senate, the superintendent/president reappoints Fred Patrick to continue serving as the faculty member for 2023.
- On a nomination from the Associated Student Body Government, the superintendent/president reappoints Ora Shrecengost to continue serving as the student member for the remainder of the academic year 2022-23.
- At its December 20, 2022 meeting, the Allan Hancock College Board of Trustees reappointed Alejandra Enciso to continue serving as the non-voting trustee director for 2023.

 - 4.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Keli Seyfert noted the non-cash contribution of \$5,000 is a scholarship from Follett to the Auxiliary Programs Corporation and offered to respond to questions.

Jennifer Schwartz noted a deficit balance for PCPA and explained there is a lapse in audience attendance due to the pandemic. There are income gaps in ticket sales and concessions. She said they received the California Shuttered Venue Operators Grant for \$250,000 and other donations which will help carry PCPA through the year with their deficit.

Ms. Schwartz noted *Cinderella* was close to reaching its ticket sales goal.

Trustee Enciso arrived at 3:37 p.m.

4.b. PCPA Volunteer Recognition

Jennifer Schwartz acknowledged PCPA volunteers. Dr. Walthers would like to send thank you letters to the volunteers.

4.c. Oral Reports

<u>PCPA</u>

Mark Booher shared the challenges of managing illnesses from COVID-19 and flu season. He said PCPA cancelled one show due to the flu amongst cast and crew members. PCPA completed their outreach tour with 46 performances of *Breaking Through* by Dr. Jimenez at 28 schools. The outreach tour also included free public performances in Guadalupe and Santa Maria. He shared the pre-production schedule for spring performances.

Mr. Booher provided a staffing update, noting 14 employees are new within the past year. He said they are excited about the progress of the new PCPA Stagecraft building and are scheduling the move between April and May. Mr. Booher added he is on a task force to manage the use of the Patty Boyd Recital Hall in the Fine Arts Complex.

ATHLETICS

Kim Ensing reported all of the fall sports have concluded. She added, every sport, except men's soccer, extended their season. She thanked Keli Seyfert's Auxiliary Accounting team for their extra work postseason. She said Hancock football won the James Cobb Strawberry Bowl. Ms. Ensing shared the coach for women's soccer, Billy Vinnedge, was selected as Coach of the Year. She noted this is the first time Hancock has had a women's golf team and they participated in a postseason game.

She announced the Toys for Tots basketball tournament is this weekend and commended the interim women's basketball coach for doing a great job. The women's basketball team is currently 5-2. Ms. Ensing was happy to share they will be adding a Math cohort to the English cohort program for athletes and added the success rates and data are undisputable. Ms. Ensing thanked Dr. Walthers for the Thanksgiving meal gift cards for students. She mentioned the concession stand at the baseball fields will be coming soon.

Ora Shrecengost shared her positive experience with student athletes in her classes and said she noticed how they support each other in their academics.
