MINUTES

Auxiliary Programs Corporation Board of Directors Quarterly Meeting May 15, 2020 – 11:00 AM

Due to the Coronavirus crisis and Brown Act modifications approved by Governor Newsom, the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Board of Directors meeting was held via Zoom.

1. Call to Order

Dr. Walthers called the meeting to order at 11:08 a.m. with the following directors present: Adams, Curry, Hall, Smith, Walthers

2. Public Comment

No public comment was made.

3. Action Items

3.a. Minutes of the March 5, 2020 Meeting

3.b. Acceptance of Cash Donations of \$500 or Greater to PCPA

3.c. PCPA Public Relations/Advertising Report of Expenses/In-kind Promotions/Cash Sponsorships of \$500 or Greater

On a motion by Dr. Curry, seconded by Trustee Hall, the board voted to approve the public relations/advertising expenses/in-kind trade/cash sponsorships of \$500 or greater for the period February 1, 2020 through April 30, 2020. (Ayes: Adams, Curry, Smith, Walthers; Noes: None; Concur: Hall; Absent: DeJesus)

4. Information Items

4.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Keli Seyfert reported the financials are good and have not been impacted by COVID-19. The drop in revenue is offset by the drop in expenditures. She offered to respond to any questions on the financial report.

4.b. Paycheck Protection Program – PCPA Foundation

Jennifer Schwartz gave an update on completing the application for the paycheck protection program. PCPA received \$463,100 to keep staff on payroll through June 30, 2020. Currently the money is a loan, however, there is criteria for the loan to turn into a grant. PCPA is prepared in case the loan needs to be paid back, but is hopeful the loan can be forgiven. Keli Seyfert offered to share information from a seminar on the guidelines of the program.

Eric Smith commended Jennifer Schwartz for capitalizing on the opportunity to apply for the program.

4.c. Oral Reports

PCPA

Mark Booher reported that Dr. Walthers, executive leadership, and the board of trustees were made aware of PCPA's decision to cancel the summer season as a continuation of cancelations from March due to the Coronavirus pandemic. PCPA is moving into planning for fall, noting all PCPA programs require face-to-face instruction. As a result, PCPA is looking at a delay of technical students returning in October 2020 and acting students returning in January 2021.

PCPA met with continuing students remotely to advise of the plans and there will be additional follow-up remote meetings with students. PCPA is continuing to plan for Season 57 for late fall and early spring 2021, with conservatory training continuing in summer 2021. Students that would have graduated in May 2021, are now projected to graduate by Labor Day 2021. Mark Booher noted the conservatory program performances have been shifted into online events. Due to licensing, the online performances are not open to the public and will be viewed as in-house PCPA studio work.

Athletics

Kim Ensing reported there are upcoming meetings of the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) board to discuss the future of sports and the plan for fall. Hancock College coaches are meeting remotely every week to stay engaged with student athletes. Athletics is hosting Zoom college scholarship signings and will be congratulating 12-15 student athlete graduates, one at a time, where they will be presented with their graduation sash.

5. Adjournment

Dr. Walthers adjourned the meeting at 11:26 a.m.

Background
