

Aggressive Job Posting Demand Over a Thin Supply of Regional Jobs



















Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is High




Retirement risk is about average in your area. The national average for an area this size is 84* employees 55 or older, while there are 79 here.

Occupation Age Breakdown






Occupation Race/Ethnicity Breakdown



Excludes Makeup Artists, Theatrical and Performance (39-5091), Manicurists and Pedicurists (39-5092), and Skincare Specialists (39-5094).
